

INFRASTRUCTURE MODERNIZATION

• Upgrading and modernizing the grid is a convincing message to 83% of voters.

CREATING JOBS IN AMERICA

 Messaging centered around American jobs is convincing to three-fourths of voters (76%) and very convincing to 38%.

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ARE VOTERS SUPPORTIVE OF ACTION? YES!

Supporting government action on reducing carbon pollution will benefit candidates among the general electorate and will not hurt among Republicans.

Nearly two-thirds of voters (64%) say they would feel more favorable toward their **U.S. Senator** if he or she supported the government taking action to reduce carbon pollution. Among Republicans, just a third of voters (32%) say they would be less favorable.

The data is similar for **governors** at the state level, with over half of voters (55%) saying they would feel more favorable toward their governor if he or she supported action to reduce carbon pollution. Among Republicans, just a third of voters (33%) say they would be less favorable.

"The 'America is divided' narrative on these issues is a fallacy that does not reflect where a majority of the country stands. A deeper look at the data in Centerline's national survey finds an electorate eager to reorient the focus away from what yields partisan gridlock and instead achieves tangible action."

On behalf of Centerline, Meeting Street Research and New Bridge Strategy conducted a national online survey of N=1,000 registered voters with an oversample of N=500 Republicans. Interviews were conducted May 24–27, 2023. Quotas and weighting were set to ensure the sample was demographically representative by gender, age, region, race/ethnicity, and educational attainment.
