## **Americans Support Clean Energy Initiatives According to New Poll**

*Voters foresee positive impacts of investments both locally and nationally*

**WASHINGTON, D.C.** – Centerline Liberties released a national survey today outlining the broad support amongst Americans for clean energy initiatives.

“Over the years Centerline has polled issues of importance to the American people from maternal health to election reform and clean energy. This latest national survey sends a clear message that Americans are more united than divided when it comes to the economic opportunities and job creation stemming from domestic clean energy production, manufacturing, and infrastructure. Lawmakers should take note, a bipartisan majority of voters see advanced clean energy as central to strengthening America’s energy dominance,” said **James Dozier**, President of Centerline Liberties.

“Voters are not holding back when it comes to their support on clean energy initiatives. The data clearly depicts that Americans see that reducing carbon pollution and prioritizing investments in clean energy efforts would have real positive impacts across the nation,” said **Alex Lundry**, a GOP pollster and founder of Redbud Consulting.

“The survey results further demonstrate that a broad swath of the public believes government initiatives for an advanced energy, low-carbon future will benefit the planet, our economy, and American workers,” said **Nick Nigro**, Founder, Atlas Public Policy (a policy and data research firm).

Notable survey results on clean energy:

Voters are aware of recent clean energy initiatives and a majority support clean energy initiatives.

- 62% of voters said they were very or somewhat familiar with the fact that Congress has passed laws over the past few years to improve America’s energy future.

Many believe in future positive impacts of clean energy in their state and across the country.

- A 54% majority believe these laws will have a positive impact on their state, with 1 in 4 voters (25%) believing they will have a “major positive” impact.
- Republicans are optimistic about the impact of these programs in their state, with a majority (53%) believing they will have a positive effect.

Reducing carbon pollution is a high priority.

- 41% believe the government isn’t doing enough to reduce “carbon pollution through expanded access to clean energy,” compared to 15% who say the government is doing too much.

### Methodology

The survey was fielded September 12-16, 2024 via mixed mode methodology (cell phones, landlines, online and text-to-web) by Redbud Consulting among 800 registered voters. The margin of error is +/- 3%.
