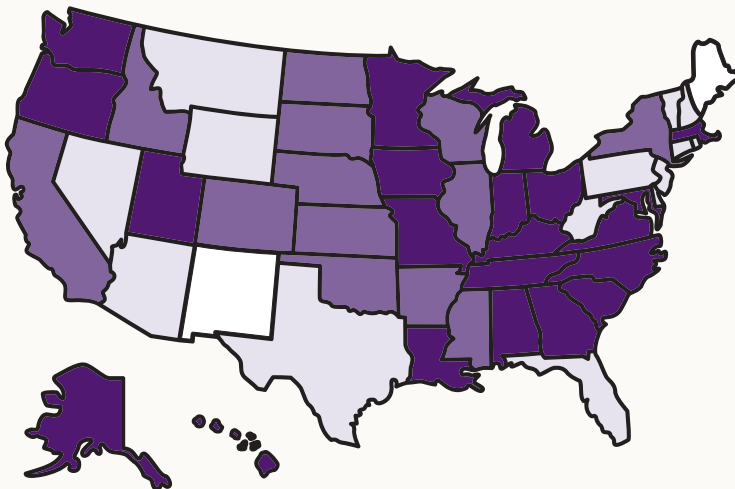


# The majority of Americans show support for **APOLITICAL GOVERNMENT CONTRACTING.**

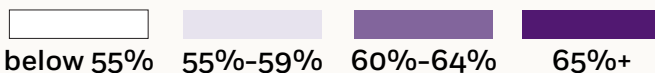
Voters overwhelmingly want the government to **prioritize quality, cost, and reputation over politics** and need to be further educated on the meaning of ESG.

An overwhelming majority of voters want the government to keep politics out of contracting decisions. **70% of voters want** state officials to prioritize quality, cost, and reputation of the product and company over decisions the company has made on political issues.

## SUPPORT FOR APOLITICAL CONTRACTING

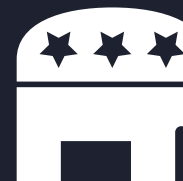
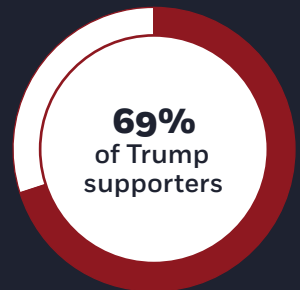
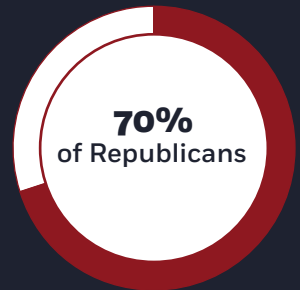


Percent surveyed who **agree** that states should not choose who to do business with by ideology or politics:

Republican voters are net supporters of politics-free contracting, including a strong majority of Trump voters.

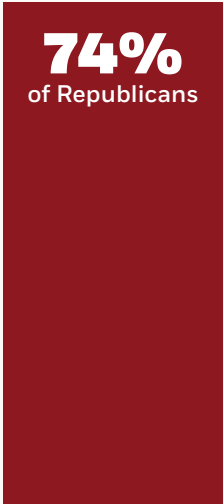
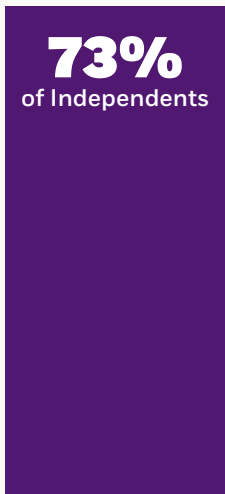

Across party lines, solid majorities of Democrats, Independents, and Republicans believe cost and quality should be prioritized over political stances when it comes to government contracting.

**METHODOLOGY:** The key findings and data shared in this one-pager come from Centerline Liberties' recent national survey of 800 registered voters conducted September 12-16, 2024, via mixed mode methodology (cell phones, landlines, online and text-to-web). The survey has a margin of error of +/- 3%.
