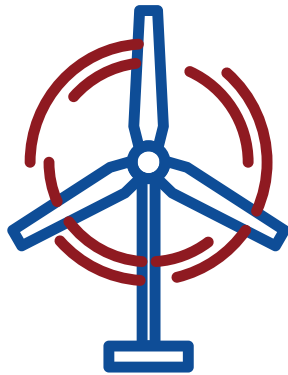


Across the nation, American voters believe in the positive impact of investments in **CLEAN ENERGY.**

Reducing carbon emissions is a high priority for most voters across the country, including increasing clean energy initiatives.

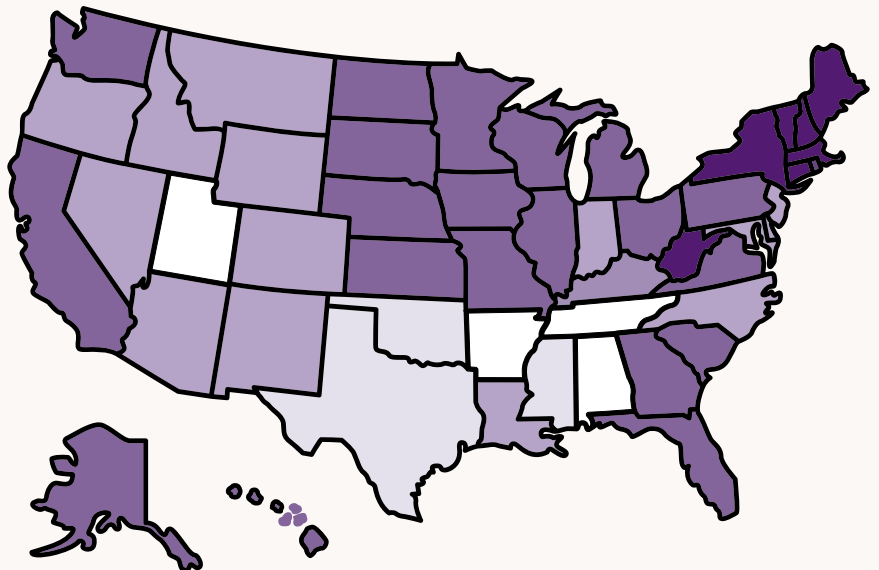
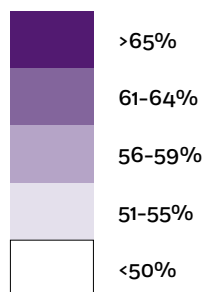

Support is widespread across the country, with the deep South most split.

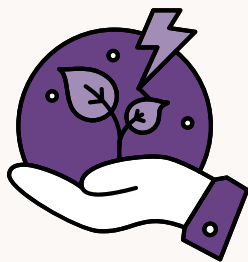
Percent surveyed who think the government should **fund clean energy**:



“The data clearly depicts that Americans see that **reducing carbon pollution and prioritizing investments in clean energy efforts** would have real positive impacts across the nation.”

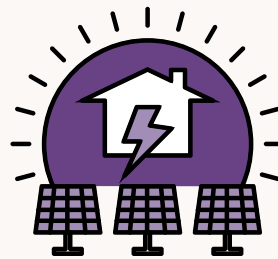

IMPACT OF CLEAN ENERGY LEGISLATION ON STATE AND COUNTRY



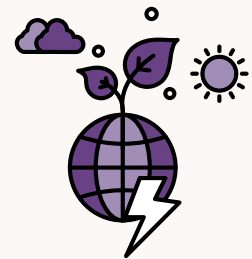

METHODOLOGY: The key findings and data shared in this one-pager come from Centerline Liberties' recent national survey of 800 registered voters conducted September 12-16, 2024, via mixed mode methodology (cell phones, landlines, online and text-to-web). The survey has a margin of error of +/- 3%.

The survey covered a number of topics; this one-pager focuses on data collected regarding clean energy.
