

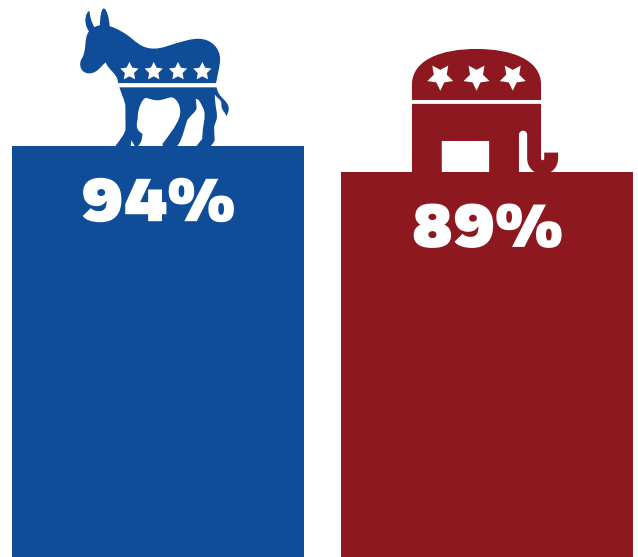

BIPARTISAN SUPPORT FOR MENTAL HEALTH CARE

Both Democrats (94%) and Republicans (89%) believe that **insurance companies need to stop getting in between patients and doctors**, and that they should not be able to deny mental health coverage if a doctor prescribes it.

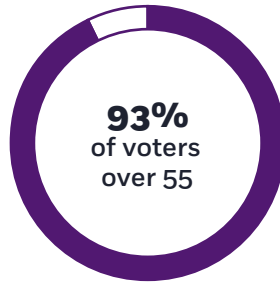
There is net support for requiring insurers to cover prescribed mental health care among every key demographic, including Trump voters (+67) and Republicans (+69).



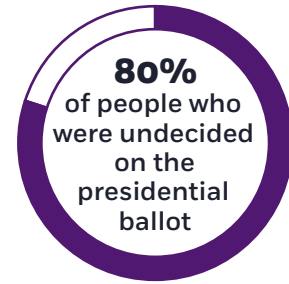
THERE IS NEAR UNIVERSAL VOTER SUPPORT FOR MENTAL HEALTH INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS



Support requiring insurers to cover mental health care prescribed by a doctor.



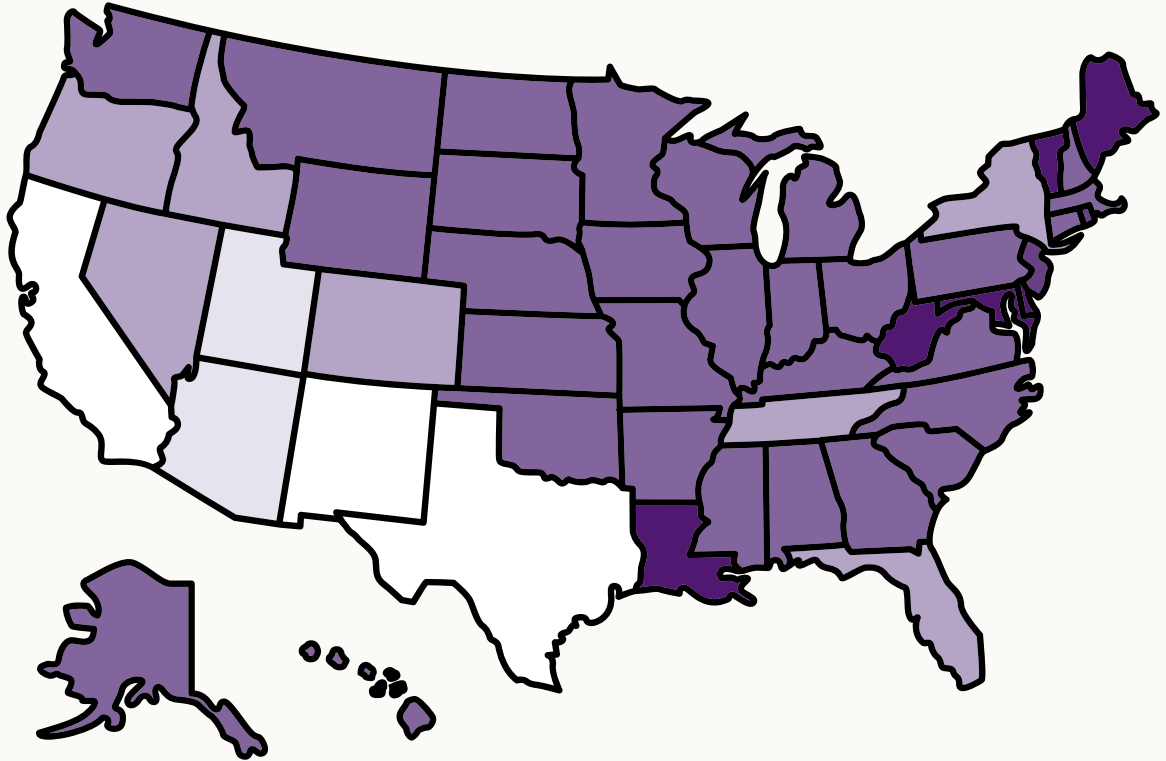
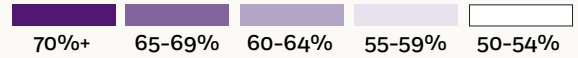
Support insurance requirements for mental health care.

METHODOLOGY: The key findings and data shared in this one-pager come from Centerline Liberties' recent national survey of 800 registered voters conducted September 12-16, 2024, via mixed mode methodology (cell phones, landlines, online and text-to-web). The survey has a margin of error of +/- 3%.

The survey covered a number of topics; this one-pager focuses on data collected regarding mental health.
