New National Survey Finds Overwhelming Bipartisan Support for Access to Contraception

More funding for contraception and initiatives to protect access to IVF wanted across the country

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Today, Centerline Liberties released a national survey detailing widespread bipartisan support for expanding access to affordable contraception and efforts to protect in-vitro fertilization (IVF).

“Over the years Centerline has polled issues of importance to the American people from contraceptive care and access to clean energy and election reform. This latest national survey sends a strong, clear message that Americans, across all demographics, are overwhelmingly unified when it comes to ensuring access to affordable contraception. In fact, a bipartisan supermajority of voters say it is a good thing for society. Lawmakers should take note, voters do not view access to contraceptive care as a partisan issue, rather they firmly believe it as a matter of individual liberty,” said **James Dozier**, President of Centerline Liberties.

“The data speaks for itself – Americans unquestionably support measures to increase access to affordable contraception. What is remarkable is the support spans across political party, gender and geographic location. In a time where the country appears so divided, there truly are issues that all Americans care about and are looking to their elected officials to act upon,” said **Alex Lundry**, a GOP pollster and founder of Redbud Consulting.

“Centerline’s latest poll demonstrates the unmistakable fact that Americans support pro-family policies including increased access to affordable contraception and IVF. These are not just women’s issues, they are a family and American issue that has wide reaching impacts,” said **Barbara Comstock**, former U.S. Representative and Centerline Liberties Advisory Board member.

Notable survey results on support for expanded access to affordable contraception:

Supermajorities across the political spectrum –including swing voters and men– view public funding for programs that provide people with increased access to contraceptives and family planning services as good for our society.

- More than 7 out of 10 (73%) say public funding of contraception is a good thing – including 61% of Republicans, 73% of Independents, and 75% of men.
- 61% of undecideds on the presidential ballot believe that public funding of contraceptives and family planning services is a good thing for society.

Voters across the country believe public funding for contraception is a good thing for society.

- 85% of voters in the Northeast, 77% of voters in the Midwest, 68% of voters in the South, and 71% of voters in the West believe public funding of contraception to be a VERY good thing for society.

There is universal, bipartisan support for affordable contraception.

- 91% of all voters agree that "All people in the United States should be able to both afford and have access to contraception. They should also be able to obtain information on what method of contraception would be best for them."
- 90% of men agree (and 57% of men strongly agree) that "all people in the US should be able to both afford and have access to (it)."

Voters see contraception as an individual right.

- 91% of registered voters (and 86% of Republicans, 91% of Independents) agree that *"Every individual has a right to make and carry out one's own healthcare decisions on contraception and fertility treatment."*

IVF has broad appeal across the country.

- 79% of registered voters favor protecting access to IVF, a type of fertility treatment where eggs are combined with sperm outside the body in a lab to form an embryo.
- Support is consistently high across party lines with 74% of Republicans, 84% of Democrats and 77% of Independents in favor of protecting access to IVF.

Methodology

The survey was fielded September 12-16, 2024 via mixed mode methodology (cell phones, landlines, online and text-to-web) by Redbud Consulting among 800 registered voters. The margin of error is +/- 3%.
